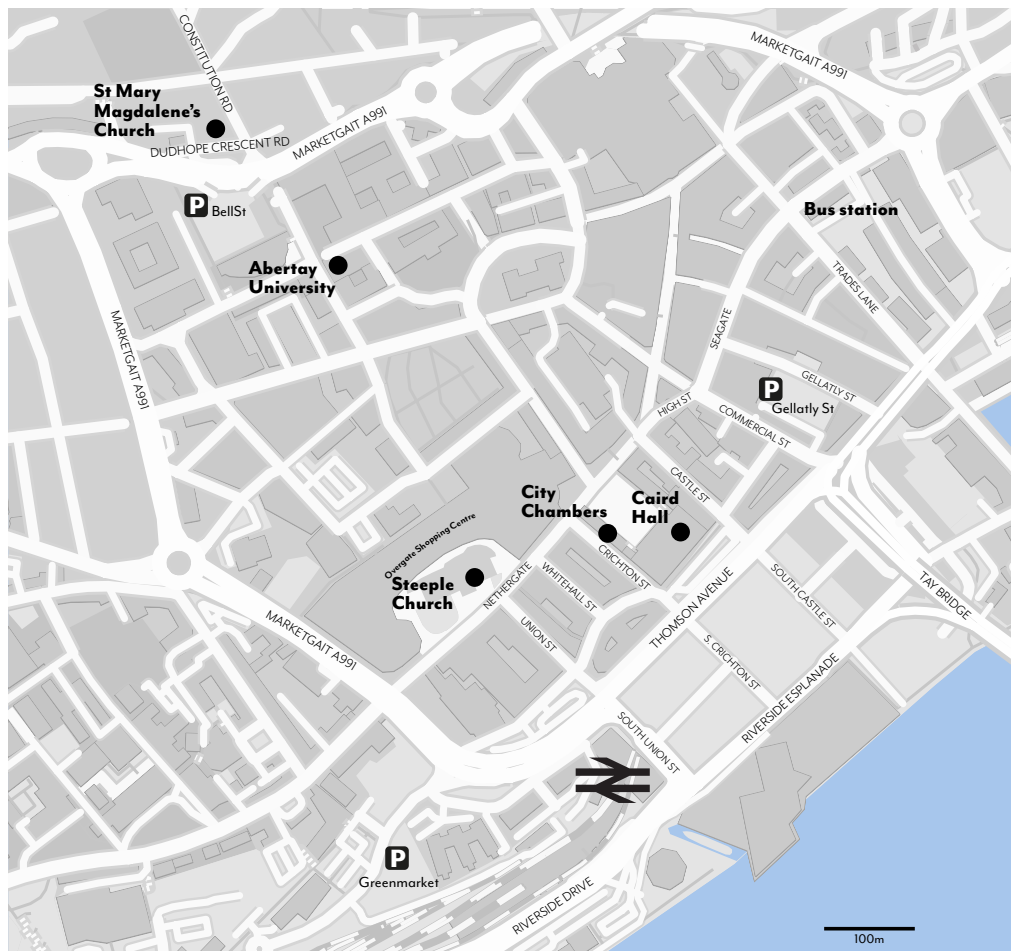


Transport

Dundee is easily reached by rail or by road. Trains run hourly from Glasgow and Aberdeen, and roughly half-hourly from Edinburgh. The journey time in each case is just over an hour. The Friday venues are a 15-minute uphill walk from Dundee station. The Saturday venues are 5 minutes away.

If you are bringing your car, the multi-storey car parks at Gellatly Street and Greenmarket are within walking distance of the Saturday venues. Limited on street parking is available near St Mary Magdalene's; this is free after 6pm. Please note that the Bell Street multi-storey car park, which is across from the church, closes to arrivals at 6pm.
