Grades:

Class 1 Imperative to save or preserve.
Class 2 Important to save or preserve.
Class 3 Might be saved and worth saving.
Class 4 Unlikely to be saved but may be a good - and maybe useful - organ.
Unclassified Of limited interest to potential acquirers.

The above grades do not necessarily reflect quality, or the condition, of the organs which follow. They rather reflect the practicalities of relocation and the musical and technical integrity of the instruments, which for possible relocation abroad is often a deciding factor. A summary list of each class of organ follows at the end. Another list shows organs with one manual, two manuals, etc. Photographs can be supplied or found showing most of the organs - for these and information on the instruments, plus photographs, contact Alan Buchan on <u>alanbuchan@btinternet.com</u>

Possible redundant organs mainly in churches which are proposed for closure (or have already closed). Please note that some churches are only *proposed* for closure and may be reprieved. Some churches may be vigorously resisting closure. New owners of buildings may wish to retain the organs. The list is arranged approximately clockwise round Scotland. Index is at the end with page numbers.

A few of the organs have gone now and a few churches have actually been reprieved, but they are still mentioned for the record meantime. <u>Orphir</u> Orkney Mainland. This church is continuing in use, but has been considering revamping its interior for a while. The small early 19th century organ may be earmarked for a residence in Ayrshire. Supplied by Clementi & Co. the builder is probably Bishop but Gray & Davison added pipework and made other alterations. No HES listing. **Class 2. <u>Fearn Abbey</u> The church is a surviving part of a 14th century abbey, and closed on 31st December 2023, although it has not been regularly used for a while. The organ is a robust 1903 1/5 by Ernest Lawton of Aberdeen, action a little noisy. Inevitably HES A-listed, but organ not mentioned. **Class 3. <u>Inverness Old High</u> church closed 2022 by C of S and now disused, Building not yet sold to an unknown prospective buyer, who may step in now that repairs are complete. 1892 Willis 2/19, rebuilt 1923 Hilsdon 2/23, rebuilt 2010 Nicholson 2/19. Might sound better in a less enclosed west end location. Here the sound is held in by an alcove. Recording made by Henry Wallace. Key action mechanical, stop and pedal electro-pneumatic. HES A-listed, but organ not mentioned. Despite a long period of dampness and neglect, organ still functioning with one or two faults. **Class 2. <u>Dingwall St. James Episcopal</u> This church has been sold to an individual and efforts to find a home for the beautifully-cased organ have failed despite some interest. 1872 Bevington, reactioned by Scovell 1907 and modified by Hill Norman & Beard 2/10 in 1931. Fine case, but pneumatic action. So future grim, if not already decided and acted upon. Not HES listed now but under consideration March 2023. **Class 4. Stop List:** Gt: od 8, Ho F1 8, Dul 8, Pr 4. <u>Alness Parish</u> church has closed in June 2024 and Rosskeen Church (continuing) has been renamed "Alness". The organ is a Lawton of 1909 1/8 no pedal, with mechanical action, finely decorated facade. **Class 3. Stop List:** Sub Bass 16, od (t & b), Hohl Fl 8, Sal 8, Viol d'Orchestre 8, Pr 4.

<u>Avoch Parish</u> Church of 1870 closed on 31st December 2023. HES B-listed, but organ not mentioned. It is a 1908 Miller 1/6 pedals for blowing only, electric motor also, divided keyboard, also B-listed by the SFO. **Class 3. Stop List:** sb 16 (one oct), lg 16 (t&b), od 8, gamba 8 (t&b), gedacht 8 (t&b), fl 4 (t&b), super oct. Minister was Rev. Dr. Warren Beattie <u>WBeattie@churchofscotland.org.uk</u> Cromarty Parish This large building is up for sale in July 2024 with the usual lack of mention or consultation about the disused 1933 Ingram organ. Auldearn Parish church still used at times. 1899 Casson Positive 1/7, overhauled Edmonstone 1993. Small organ, could be moved. HES B-listed, organ not mentioned. Class 3. Laggan Parish Church nr Newtonmore. Church closed December 2024 and a proposal by the local community to buy the building has been approved by the Kirk Session and hopefully will be accepted by 121, so the building can continue to be used by all. 1901 Casson Positive, 1/6 overhauled David Loosley 2019. HES B-listed, organ not mentioned. Class 3. Stop List: DB 16, Mel D 8, od 8, Sal 8, Ged t&b 8, Dulcet t&b 4. Transposer.

Inveravon Ballindalloch, Speyside. This country church is at a minor road end on the banks of the Spey. Local negotiations are under way on its future in the community, as it is probably to be closed in due course. Organ by Hill of London 1876, slightly enlarged by Lawton of Aberdeen to 1/7 in 1911, overhauled by Walcker in 2009. Some action changes but all mechanical, but already may require some further work if transplanted. The building may be taken over locally, but any result is possible. HES B-listed, but no mention of organ.

Nairn St. Ninian's church building proposed for closure when minister retires in due course, but no immediate risk. 1924 Willis & Lewis (a brief partnership) 2/20, overhauled Paul Miller 2015. Pneumatic action, might be made electro-pneumatic in a move. Organ built into structure behind church furnishings. No sign of HES listing. Class 2. Alves Church of 1845 closed on 1st January 2024, for sale November 2024. <u>Forres St. Laurence</u> Future of church buildings in Forres still being discussed. 1906 Lawton 3/28 using older Harrison pipework, rebuilt Hill Norman & Beard 1964. (Neighbouring St. Leonard's had a Norman & Beard but it was discarded.) Not visited yet. Electro-pneumatic action. HES B-listed, no mention of organ. St. Leonard's also B-listed, surviving organ case mentioned. **Class 4.**

<u>Birnie</u> Moray. Small Walker organ 1970 1/4. Mediaeval church, remaining open as a result of commendable campaigning, and following commendable ecumenical initiatives with the local RC church Services are still being held. Hooray! If it is true that the organ is possibly on wheels, at the rear of the church, by no stretch of the imagination can this organ be classed as a fixture, yet no doubt it is! HES A-listed, no mention of organ. **Class 3. Stop List:** Ged (t&b), Rohr Fl (t&b), Pr (t&b), Cornet (t) II. Contact: Gill Garrow ian.2gill@btinternet.com

Elgin St. Giles Despite laudably determined efforts to thwart closure, this iconic town church with attractive well-furnished interior in key town centre location may yet fall into other hands, perhaps ecclesiastical. 1884 Willis 2/18, enlarged 1910 Norman & Beard, then various rebuilds, effectively a new organ with new case from the 1980s when rebuilt and relocated by Wood Wordsworth and Sandy Edmonstone 3/37. Difficult to move, better to be kept? Church used for civic events, may hopefully be taken over and remain open for all events, some of which may like to use the organ? HES A-listed, no mention of (modern) organ case. **Class 4. Current stop list not known.** NPOR shows 1911 spec. Minister: the Rev. D. Oelofse - DOelofse@churchofscotland.org.uk

<u>Rathven Parish</u> near Buckie. church now sold and plans to develop hall for housing. Plans for church have not yet been made. 1909 Wadsworth 2/9 unaltered. Mechanical key action, all working in good condition. Pneumatic Pedal Bourdon not working. Organ and pulpit all one piece, but free-standing. Typical Aberdeen-made Wadsworth well worth retaining or relocating. HES B-listed, "1932 pulpit fronting organ" - a most unlikely date for the organ!

Dimensions: 17 ft wide (520 cm), 10 ft 8ins deep (320 cm)+ 3 for motor, c.20 ft high. **Class 2. Stop List:** Gt: od 8, Clar Fl 8, Dul 8, Harm Fl 4, manual bass 16. The North Church has essential hall facilities, though no pipe organ. Both church buildings need repair work. The organ in St. Rufus is a 1987 Nicholson rebuild of an 1892 Eustace Ingram 2/23. HES A-listed, "organ in carved case", future hopefully now secure where it is. **Class 3. Stop List:** on NPOR.

<u>Grange Parish</u> east of Keith. Church reprieved just now may close in the future. 1903 Wadsworth 1+pd/7, mechanical, largely unaltered, overhauled 2008. Typical Aberdeen-installed Wadsworth well worth retaining or relocating. Free standing case, though attached to pulpit at one corner. HES C-listed, organ only mentioned briefly. **Class 2. Stop List:** Ped B 16. Man: B t&b 16, od 8, stop d 8, Sal 8, Pr 4, Pr 2, octave. Minister: Rev. Wiekus van Straaten <u>WvanStraaten@churchofscotland.org.uk</u>.

<u>Buckie South & West</u> Church proposed for closure in due course, and future of the building uncertain. 1983 David Loosley organ 2/13 made from 1901/1928 Wadsworth, in fairly good working condition. Possibly a difficult one to relocate - better to keep? HES C-listed, organ only described as a Wadsworth 1900/01. Mechanical key and stop action. **Class 4. Stop List:** Gt: Chim Fl 8, Pr 4, Har Fl 4, 15th. Pd: B 16, Pr 8, Choral Fl 4. Sw: St d 8, Sal 8, Gems 4, Bl Fl 2, II-III, Oboe 8, Trem.

<u>Cullen Old Kirk</u> The North East Presbytery decided to close Cullen Old Kirk and retain the Hall Church in the town, creating another potential fiasco along the lines of St. Nicholas, Aberdeen or Old High, Inverness. The A-listed mediaeval interior is unlikely to attract a buyer although attempts are being made to persuade a trust to take it on. The organ, invisible to the authors of the Pevsner volume on Aberdeenshire & Moray (2015), is a Norman & Beard of 1914 (same year as the organ the firm built the Usher Hall) with pneumatic action tubes running under the stone floor. It's thus not an attractive organ to relocate. HES A-listed, but no mention of the organ's existence here either. Even if a trust is persuaded to take on this building, the organ's future is by no means inevitably secure. **Class 3. Stop List:** Gt: od 8, Clar Fl 8, Fl Trav 4. <u>Marnoch Old</u> This rural parish church closed in 2020 and had a late Wadsworth 1914 1/7 with pneumatic action, no pedal, built (as often happened) into the pulpit. Because of the action, difficult to find a good home, so better if it has stayed here. Plans to form a trust to buy the building fell through and the building is apparently taken over by a new owner, who has so far made no alterations. HES B-listed, organ location mentioned. **Class 4. Stop List:** B t&b 16, od 8, st d 8, gamba 8, Sal 8, vc 8, pr 4, octave. New Owner: name not yet known.

<u>Turriff St. Andrew's</u> Although this church is widely used by the community, spacious and with excellent facilities, it is proposed to close it by 2026. 1910 Wadsworth 2/12, unaltered, mechanical key action, pneumatic pedal dept., in excellent condition. <u>Fraserburgh Old</u> Church now closed despite a campaign and no services are being allowed. 1892 Forster & Andrews of Hull 2/17, of high quality, attached to woodwork of gallery on both sides, mechanical, in working order. Deserves to be retained or relocated, though the latter option would create a gaping *lacuna* in the architecture. HES B-listed, no description of interior. **Class 1. <u>Peterhead Old</u> (Muckle Kirk) closed 2016, and disused. Building up for sale and under offer. R&D extension organ 2/28 from 5 ranks located in 20th century minimalist case in corner of gallery. HES A-listed, no mention of organ. **Unclassified. Stop List:** Gt: 16, 8,8,8, 4, 4, 12th, 2, 2, II, Tpt 8. Sw: 8, 8, 4, 4, Naz, Fl 2, Lar, 1, III, D Tpt 16, Tpt 8, Clarion 4. Pd: 16, 8. 8. 4. <u>Peterhead St. Andrew's</u> The C of S and/or the mega-NE Presbytery are keen to shut this church, and have happily been met with resistance to union; it remains to be seen what will happen in due course. It apparently has a fairly original Wadsworth organ of 1902 2/17, but amateur repairs led to problems years ago and it has been disused since the 1980s. Access may be difficult due to stored material. This organ has not been inspected, but is worth being concerned about. No HES listing, so organ could be moved without fuss. <u>Tyrie</u> nr Fraserburgh. Church closed December 2023 but still occasional funerals. Organ 1903 Lawton 1/6, compact, could easily be relocated. HES B-listed, no mention of interior. **Class 2.**

Colin Strong - <u>CStrong@churchofscotland.org.uk</u> <u>New Pitsligo Parish</u> This church in a large-sized village closed in December 2023 but can still be used when required for the moment; an Episcopal church also exists here. The organ in the C of S is a virtually unaltered, but quite large, Lawton of 1904 2/17. The action is mechanical, therefore durable and movable, but the organ, though free-standing is built into the pulpit, so that relocation would involve alteration and surgery. A good potentially reliable organ but difficult to market as made by a local Aberdeen builder. HES C-listed, no interior description. **Class 2. <u>New Deer</u> A large building, always too large for the village, and in need of repairs; the final Sunday service took place on 30th September 2024. Occasional funerals still take place. 1878 Father Willis 2/12, used as a temporary organ at Edinburgh, Canterbury and Gloucester cathedrals before arriving here in 1887. Almost entirely original, mechanical action throughout, including the Pedal stop which unusually is an Open Wood. Overhauled Loosley 1975. In fairly good order, fully deserving relocation. HES B-listed, no mention of organ. **Class 1. Stop List:** Gt: od 8, Dul 8, Clar Fl 8, Pr 4, Flute Har 4, 15th, Tpt 8. Sw: lg 8, od 8, Gems 4, Corno 8. Pd: od 16. G/P, S/P, S/G. <u>(Old) Deer</u> Proposed for closure in December 23, but happily enthusiasm to continue is clear and there are no immediate plans for a change; a successful recital took place in July 24. Father Willis of 1898 2/14. Plans to form a community group to take over are being discussed and any change in ownership may be two or three years away. Mechanical action, pneumatic pedal, well maintained in the past. No HES listing? **Class 1. <u>Huntly Cairnie Glass</u> (Huntly Parish) This one is a deferred union, so closure is not imminent and hopefully may never happen! Organ housed in fine Classical case by Matthews & Mackenzie 1893 with Corinthian pillars, free standing. Organ itself by Ingram 1894/R&D 1961 2/23, with new stop engravings from 1961. Building HES B-listed, no specific mention of interior. **Class 3**.

<u>Foveran Parish</u> This church closed in 2008 but only went up for sale in 2022, and was sold, without any proper discussion on the organ's future. 1900 Lawton 2/12, mechanical key action, built into pulpit. Mice damage probably confined to reservoir corners, but wind trunk missing. Worth relocating despite being part of the pulpit architecture, but fate may have intervened. HES B-listed, organ chamber 1900-01 noted. **Class 2. Stop List:** Gt: SB 16, od 8, Hohl Fl 8, Dul 8, Har Fl 4. Sw: vd 8, Sal 8, vc 8, lg 8, Salicet 4, Oboe 8. Pd: B 16 (tp). G/P, S/P, S/G.

<u>Foveran Holyrood Chapel</u> Newburgh. In addition to closing Foveran Parish Church, a mile south of the town, the C of S now wish to close what has been the church for the town of Newburgh. The congregation is to be confined to the church hall, previously used as a café. The organ here is a later Wadsworth, 1913 2/11 with a free-standing case, but undecorated grey facade. It is not in perfect working order, with some pedal notes (pneumatic) missing, but the key action is working. Would be worth relocating. HES B-listed but no mention of the organ which dominates one end of the chapel. **Class 2. Stop List:** Gt: Man Bass 16, od 8, Rohr Fl 8, Pr 4, 15th. Sw: vd 8, lg 8, Gamba 8, vc 8, Gems 4, Oboe 8. <u>Barthol Chapel</u> Final church service held in June 2023 and although there was a strong movement towards community purchase, the small organ c1845 by John Renton of Edinburgh 1/5 (probably in Portsoy at first, then Mulben, rebuilt by Goldsmith here 1976) had to go. So it is in the process of being moved to Helensburgh, though not completed. HES application 2018, but not designated. **Class 3. <u>Cluny Parish</u> This rural church has apparently been closed and united into Bennachie Parishes. The organ is a 1911 Vincent 2/8, overhauled in 2012 by the late Sandy Edmonstone. HES B-listed but no interior description. Unclassified. Stop list not to hand. Minister: Rev. Euan Glen - <u>GGlen@churchofscotland.org.uk</u>

(Culsalmond &) Rayne This rural church is proposed for closure. It received a one manual Lawton of 1910 1+pd/7 from Kintore UK in 1929 which was recently overhauled by the late Sandy Edmonstone. HES B-listed, but organ not mentioned. Class 3. Stop List not to hand.

<u>Fintray</u> near Inverurie. The Church of Scotland is apparently trying to close this wellmaintained rural church with a Walcker Dulsannel organ 1901 1/7. Unusually for a Dulsannel, the organ was in excellent condition when inspected a few years ago. HES B-listed, but no interior description. **Class 4. <u>Aberdeen Holburn West</u> Church closed 2023, but the church is now well organised and run by the Great Western Community Trust, with appointment of a musical director pending. Thus the 1922 Abbott & Smith/Mander 1974 2/18 is off the danger list. We keep it on this list just to inspire others! It has been disused, on and off, since 1988, when an electronic was first proposed. The current electronic is on its last legs. <u>Crieff St. Michael's</u> The parish church of Crieff (St. Michael's) has suddenly appeared on the C of S website for sale in October 2024 without warning; the congregation is now confined to the church hall, the former St. Andrew's Church which had an organ, but a praise band is in full swing. There is no surrounding cemetery and the building is HES B-listed, so housing conversion could happen. The organ in St. Michael's was an 1882 Forster & Andrews, rebuilt most recently in 1963 by Hilsdon of Glasgow 2/27 and in good working order. **Unclassified** so far, organ but not stop list on NPOR, but obtainable.
